CAMP DESCRIPTIONS

A Traveler Through A Mathematical World

This is a problem-solving enrichment journey. Students will spend each day with two different teachers and experience several different approaches to problem-solving, enhancing students' ability to tackle standardized test questions. We will focus on arithmetic, geometry, number theory, probability and statistics. Our goal is to help students develop and master concepts and formulas in order to improve their overall understanding of math. Throughout the week, students will participate in projects, activities, discussions, games and will leave with a mathematical passport full of definitions, formulas, strategies and real-world relevance! **A-01**

Grades 4 to 10 Maggie Connolly, Kelly Gelles, Chery Webb

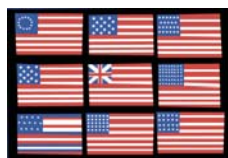

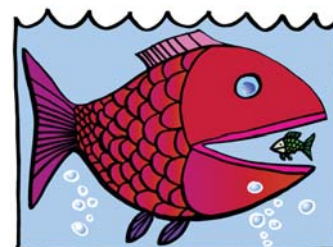


Yummy Creations

Directions to The Green Vale School

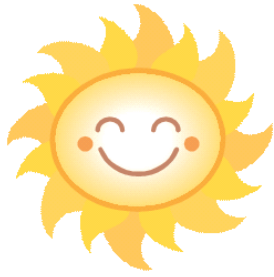
Take the Long Island Expressway (I-495) to **Exit 39** (Glen Cove Road) and head **NORTH** on **Glen Cove Road**.

Drive **NORTH** on Glen Cove Road approximately 2 miles and make a right onto **Northern Blvd. (Rte. 25A)**. There is a Pathmark on the right at that corner.

Travel **EAST** on Northern Blvd. and then turn left at the third traffic light, onto **Valentine's Lane**, just past the DeMatteis Heart Center. There is a blue and white sign on the corner with the School's name on it. The New York Institute of Technology is at the same intersection. If you pass Valentine's Lane you will end up at the C.W. Post campus. The School's main entrance is the third driveway on the right on Valentine's Lane.

All camps are run by faculty and staff of The Green Vale School.
A registered Nurse will be on duty, on campus, during camp sessions.
A snack will be provided each day for all campers.
